Last year we introduced an Extended Day Provision to complement our school offering. As we start the new school year, we are pleased to say we have a number of places available.

Extended Day Provision provides pupils with the opportunity to build on the social communication, interaction and life skills they are developing in school in a **fun, enriching, relaxed** and **nurturing** environment. This is a small group setting, delivered by our experienced staff, and led by Mr Gary Hayes.

Please find a welcome from Mr Hayes below and information on how to find out more for your child... *"Just to introduce myself to you all... I am Gary Hayes, the Team Leader for the Extended Day Provision. This provision runs in school from Monday to Thursday, from 3.30pm to 6.30pm, where we provide a relaxing and social evening for our young people wishing to develop interests and friendships. The session also supports families and carers who may be working, to take the opportunity to have their young person in a safe and well managed provision within the school setting."*

Where is it based and what activities are involved?

EDP is based in school with access to many facilities and wellbeing options, plus opportunities to explore the local areas for exercise and activities. We provide the young people with a snack and light tea, and they are encouraged to get involved with the menu choices and food preparation, to develop independence and life skills.
